Privacy Act Statement

This privacy act statement is located on the back of the FD-258 fingerprint card.

Authority: The FBI's acquisition, preservation, and exchange of fingerprints and associated information is generally authorized under 28 U.S.C. 534. Application Process

Any person wishing to apply for a concealed handgun permit instructor must present themselves in person at a Nebraska State Patrol Troop Area Headquarters and submit the following at time of application: ☐ Completed, signed, and notarized application form. Applicants are advised to obtain the application form in advance because the form must be notarized, and notaries may not always be available at Troop Area Headquarters. Application forms will be available at each Troop Area Headquarters and at https://www.statepatrol.nebraska.gov/. ☐ **Proof of identification.** The applicant will be required to provide identification at the time of application consisting of a current Nebraska motor vehicle operator's license, a Nebraska identification card issued by the Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles, or an active military identification card. When providing a military identification card, please also provide a driver's license or state issued identification card for processing purposes. ☐ **Proof of vision.** The applicant may show compliance with the vision requirements by presenting a current Nebraska motor vehicle operator's license or a current vision statement by a Nebraska licensed ophthalmologist or optometrist certifying the applicant has been tested and meets the vision requirements prescribed for a Class "O" operator's license (Nebraska Revised Statutes § 60-4,118). If using a Nebraska identification card issued by the Nebraska Department of Motor Vehicles, a vision statement will be needed for proof of vision. A copy of this form can be located at https://www.statepatrol.nebraska.gov/. ☐ Proof of citizenship or legal/lawful status in the United States. Applicants cannot be an alien illegally or unlawfully in the United States. Proof of citizenship may be a state certified birth certificate showing birth in the United States, a copy of naturalization papers, a Certificate of Citizenship issued by the United States Immigration authorities, or a signed current or expired United States passport. Proof of legal/lawful status in the United States may be a Permanent Resident Card (i.e. green card), Employment Authorization Card, Visa, and/or I-94 admission number. Please note: If the name listed on the application does not match the name on the proof of citizenship provided, legal documentation showing name change (such as a marriage certificate, divorce decree or court order) may be required. ☐ **Proof of training.** The applicant may show compliance with the training requirement by providing a *notarized* Firearms Instructor Certification to teach handgun courses. This may be a certificate as a State of Nebraska Certified Firearms Instructor (law enforcement only), a National Rifle Association Certified Pistol Instructor, or instructor in any other program meeting the standards for instructor certification under Nebraska Revised Statute(s) and Administrative Code. ☐ Current certificate, permit, or license. The applicant must present a current firearms purchase certificate under Neb. Rev. Stat. 69-2401 to 69-2409, a current concealed handgun permit under the Concealed Handgun Permit Act, or a current Federal Firearms License issued by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms & Explosives. ☐ Proposed course curriculum. The universal NSP curriculum is available on the Nebraska State Patrol website at: https://statepatrol.nebraska.gov/services/concealed-handgun-permits/chp-instructor-curriculum-minimum-requirements. Please note: No information can be removed from this curriculum. While additions can be included, they must be submitted for approval. If using your own drafted curriculum, it will also need to be submitted for approval. Any curriculum questions may be directed to: nsp.chpinstructorinfo@nebraska.gov. ☐ Photograph. A color photograph will be taken by the Nebraska State Patrol. The photograph shall display the full, front head and facial features of the applicant who shall not wear sunglasses or attire that obscures a feature of applicant's face. ☐ **Fingerprints.** Fingerprints of the applicant will be obtained at the time of application by utilizing the Livescan equipment of the Nebraska State Patrol's Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS). ☐ Applicable fee. The fee shall be paid with the application and shall be paid by cash or check made payable to the Nebraska State Patrol. If using our online fingerprint appointment calendar, payment using a credit/debit card or e-check is acceptable.

Completed applications will be transmitted to the Nebraska State Patrol Criminal Identification Division in Lincoln for processing and certificate issuance. An application form which is not complete or legible will not be processed. A notice of deficiency will be mailed to the applicant who will have five (5) calendar days to submit information or documents to correct the deficiency. If the deficiency is not corrected within this time period, the application will be returned to the applicant who will then have to reinitiate the application process if he or she wishes to obtain a certificate.
